

On 21/04/2020 and 22/04/2020, the State Executive Committee (SEC) reviewed implementation of the directions issued by the Chairperson, National Executive Committee and as conveyed by the MHA from time to time.

After deliberation, the SEC has taken certain decisions for the proper implementation of the above instructions. Please find enclosed herewith a copy of minutes of SEC meeting for necessary action. The same has approval of the Chairman, SDMA.

Minutes of Meeting of the State Executive Committee held in the Forest Bhavan, on 22st April, 2020

On 22/04/2020, a meeting of State Executive Committee (SEC) was held under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary (also Principal Secretary, PWD), Goa and the following other members of the SEC also attended:

1. Shri Puneet Goel, Principal Secretary, Science and Technology
2. Shri S.K. Bhandari, Secretary, Transport
3. Shri Sanjay Kumar, Secretary Revenue, Member Secretary, SEC & SDMA

The SEC was briefed about the reports on Law & Order, Trucks Movement, Relief & Shelters, and Covid Status Report (copy attached).

The other officers (as per the list Annexed), also attended the meeting as special invitees.

After deliberation on the current situation, the SEC noted and decided the following:

1. **Status of COVID19:** Secretary Health informed that no new Covid-19 case has been detected after 3rd April 2020. As on date, Goa had seven positive cases of Covid-19, and all seven patients have recovered. After recovery, these patients are shifted to a Quarantine facility outside the Covid Hospital. 106 tests for Covid, the highest for any day so far, were done during the last 24 hours, on SARI/ILI patients, all of which were negative. The SEC noted with caution that Goa had not yet faced any community transmission.
2. Secretary, Health shared the plan to test and quarantine the incoming seafarers, as per the SOP issued by the MHA. The Health department is setting up a testing facility at MPT. Another facility is to be created at Pattradevi for those who might come by road from Mumbai. The Health department intends to complete the testing within 24 hours and these seafarers shall remain in the ship till the results of the tests are clear. If tested negative, they should be shifted to an institutional quarantine facility for 14 days, and if tested positive, they should be shifted to Covid Hospital. The Cabinet has further decided that the payment for their lodging and food at the institutional quarantine should be made by the employer company.
3. Secretary, Health also informed that the priority to deploy Kiosks (to take the samples safely) has changed after the MHA's clearance for the Sign on/Sing off of seafarers. In the first stage, the four Kiosks would be put up at MPT. After taking the sample by swab, the testing will be done at a testing facility at Bicholim, which is being set right now. The department has worked out a testing protocol with MPT. She also informed that anyone who wants to Sign On, needs to get their tests done by the private agencies at their own cost.



4. Secretary, Agriculture informed that the agricultural activities are normal. With the 12 Harvester currently in use, about 55 % harvesting is already complete in the State. The SEC asked him to extend all possible help to the farmers.
5. Secretary AH & V explained the role played by NGOs and especially three activists who are our warriors playing a great role in the welfare of animals/birds. During the lockdown, he has shared many heart touching stories of saving and caring for injured stray dogs, cats, owl, cows, and wild animals. The SEC expressed its gratitude towards the work done by the department along with these NGOs.
6. Director, IT informed that entries of movement of vehicles at all border checkpoints is normal, and being monitored through the new web application. She suggested that police and executive magistrate are doing separate but mostly similar entries about the movement of vehicles. The SEC agreed with her proposal to develop a unified application with suitable amendments in the existing application in use. The SEC appreciated the role of Director, IT for her efforts to develop and deploy the web application in such a very short time.
7. The Nodal Officer (Foreigners) informed that till date 5708 foreigners have left Goa in 29 special ferry flights.
8. Commissioner (Excise) informed that 30 extra Excise guards were deployed at the borders. The SEC clarified that these guards would also work under the overall supervision of the Executive Magistrates currently deployed at borders, who in turn report to the Collectors. The Excise department has also procured two emergency lights for each Border post to deal with any interruption of power supply. The SEC asked CE (Electricity) to examine the possibility of providing uninterrupted power supply at border checkpoints. Commissioner(Excise) also added that the liquor manufacturers have produced about 2.9 lakh liters of sanitisers.
9. Collector South-Goa raised the problem of time lag between a seafarer testing negative and starting to move to his own State, due to lack of advance tie up for the vehicle. The SEC clarified that the State should wait for the SOP to be issued by DG, Shipping, before freezing the procedure at the State level.
10. Shri CR Garg, District Observer informed that prices of essential commodities are stable, but of *Tur Daal*. The supply is expected to ease once distribution of pulses through the Public Distribution Shops start.
11. Secretary, Panchayat informed that he has issued the order for authorising Panchayat Secretaries to issue the necessary permissions, as earlier directed by the SEC.
12. Secretary, Health shared that the Government of India has appreciated the State for being the first to train and utilise the services of the Ayush doctors for the Covid related duties. The SEC expressed its satisfaction on the development. Director, FDA



also shared that the highest percentage of Pharma units are operating in Goa as compared to anywhere in the Country.

13. Secretary, Finance held a special SLBC meeting with bankers, regarding modalities of implementation of the three-month moratorium on the repayment of the loans. The SLBC decided to recommend a longer term moratorium, after listening to the representatives of tourism industries.
14. PCCF informed that about 2,500 cubic metre of Timber, of which 130 cubic meter is of good quality, has been put to auction. He also apprised that no fire incident took place for the last few days.
15. PCE(PWD) informed the Salouli dam production of water has picked up and by tomorrow the production would be normal. Water supply at other places is normal.
16. CE(Electricity) informed that electricity services are normal and cash collection April has started.
17. Secretary, Civil Supply informed that the supply of groceries is normal. From 27th April, the distribution of Toor dal and next month's ration would start from PDS shops. As approved by the Cabinet, the APL card holders will also get the subsidized rice of 5 kg per card for two months.
18. MD, KTCL informed that today 146 buses were running on the routes planned for picking up the Government servants and health workers. These buses ferried 1828 passengers in the morning shift.
19. Secretary, Fisheries sought clarification on the entry of the staff living on barges. The SEC clarified that barges with Indian crew coming from other ports are also covered under the receipt relaxation given by the MHA for seafarers.
20. DIG informed that after verification regarding the unauthorised movement of people through offroad tracks, the department is of the view that :
 - a. All such offroad tracks are generally used by local villagers only.
 - b. The less used tracks can be dug up to make them unusable after the consultation with local village heads.

Committee also conveyed to all concerned that as per MHA orders, any person violating these containment measures or not complying with the above directions will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action u/s 188 of the IPC.
