

Minutes of Meeting of the State Executive Committee held in the Forest Bhavan, on 20th April, 2020

On 20/04/2020, a meeting of State Executive Committee (SEC) was held under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary (also Principal Secretary, PWD), Goa and the following other members of the SEC also attended:

1. Shri Puneet Goel, Principal Secretary, Science and Technology
2. Shri S.K. Bhandari, Secretary, Transport
3. Shri Sanjay Kumar, Secretary Revenue, Member Secretary, SEC & SDMA

The SEC was briefed about the reports on Law & Order, Trucks Movement, Relief & Shelters, and Covid Status Report (copy attached).

The other officers (as per the list Annexed), also attended the meeting as special invitees.

After deliberation on the current situation, the SEC noted and decided the following:

1. **Status of COVID19:** Secretary Health informed that no new Covid-19 case has been detected after 3rd April 2020. As on date, Goa had seven positive cases of Covid-19, and all seven patients have recovered. After recovery, these patients are shifted to a Quarantine facility outside the Covid Hospital. 78 tests for Covid were done during the last 24 hours, on SARI/ILI patients, all of which were negative. The SEC noted with caution that Goa had not yet faced any community transmission.
2. The Secretary Health informed that the analysis of the data of the House-to-House survey had been completed and the report has been submitted by the Committee headed by Dr Jagadish Cacodcar, Professor and Head of the department of Preventive and Social Medicine, GMC. According to the report, there are around 5000 cases which have reported Influenza Like Illness (ILI) symptoms. Tests will now be undertaken for them in a phased manner as per the testing protocol.
3. DIG informed that five people (two by a railway track and three by sea) entered the State from Karwar side with the connivance of nine boat owners/fishermen. All these people have been put in the paid quarantine and they will undergo requisite tests for Covid. The police department has also registered two FIRs and is taking further legal action against all involved. Secretary, Fisheries informed that the department would take steps, as per law, to cancel their license. The SEC clarified that any such person who enters Goa without authorisation will be put in a paid Quarantine centre and mandatorily tested.
4. PCE(PWD) informed that 4 of the 37 continuing works have started. Similarly, in WRD 6 out of 25 works, and in the Electricity department 3 out of 7. CE of Sewerage Corporation stated that 9 out of 17 works have begun. The SEC advised gradual starting of the permitted activities by utilising the available manpower and resources

in the State. Priority may be given to the works that need to be completed before the monsoon. The departments should ensure strict compliance of the various conditions, for such works to be undertaken during this period of the lockdown, as per the revised guidelines issued by the MHA on 15/04/2020 and its addendums issued thereafter.

5. DIG informed that manning all access control points of the industrial estates by the police appears difficult due to lack of sufficient manpower. After discussions, the SEC advised augmenting the security by using private security agencies for access control, through the local Industrial Associations, under the supervision of the police force.
6. Secretary, Health informed that 1000 Thermal guns, which were received earlier have been distributed and departments have raised an additional demand for another 1000 guns. The departments would get these on the receipt of the second tranche, which is expected in a couple of days.
7. Secretary, Health informed that they plan to put Smart Kiosks (under CSR), which will have the facility to take samples safely, and will be provided Thermal guns by the Health department. The Health department has decided to install them, in order of priority, at the border checkpoints, industrial estates, Panjim Urban Health centre, Airport and MPT. This expansion of the sample taking facility would decentralise the process and help in safe collection of samples.
8. Secretary, Agriculture informed that vegetable supply has got strained since the past few days, as the vegetable *Mandi* was closed in Belagavi. The Collector, South-Goa informed that as per his discussion with the Collector Belagavi, the vegetable market in Belagavi may start functioning from tomorrow.
9. PCE(PWD) informed that normal water supply has resumed at Padocem after installation of the repaired pump. He also informed that CE (PWD-Water Supply) was with his team at Tuem alongwith Incident Commander for sorting out the water supply issues at Tuem.
10. CE(Electricity) informed that the electricity supply is normal.
11. MD, KTCL informed that KTCL ran 149 buses and ferried about 1528 Government staff. City Bus Service was also provided in Vasco, Margao and Panjim for the government servants and other healthcare workers. From tomorrow, KTCL will augment its services for some of the interior locations with 12 more buses, which will be only for the Government staff and healthcare workers.
12. Director, Panchayat raised the issue of permission to be issued to the Industrial units outside the industrial estates. The SEC has already issued the directions that Functional Managers of nearby industrial estates would issue the necessary

permission/permits to the adjacent industries outside the Industrial Estates. Secretary, Industries to issue necessary directions to the MD, GIDC, in this regard.

13. Shri Kunal, District Observer highlighted that the centre created for the people from North-East at SAI Hostel, Mapusa, North Goa is well managed and the initiative needs to be further expanded. The SEC appreciated the Collector and the Incident Commander for this initiative.
14. Shri CR Garg, District Observer informed that the supply of essentials is normal. He also informed that ITIs have started the stitching masks in their Tailoring unit. The initiative would further strengthen the supply chain.
15. Secretary, Civil Supply informed that she has held a meeting with the distributors, and supply of essential commodities is normal. The SEC observed that pulses distribution through PDS should start as soon as possible.
16. The Nodal Officer (Foreigners) informed that till date 5283 foreigners have left Goa in 27 special ferry flights. He also added that the Ministry of Tourism, GoI, through its Goa office had sent a list of foreign/domestic tourists who sought help on starndedinindia.com portal. Nine tourists were contacted for their well being and GoI was informed accordingly.
17. Excise Commissioner informed that 10 liquor manufacturing units have produced about 2.45 lakhs liters of sanitizers till date. As earlier directed by the SEC, premises/bonds/godowns of 50 percent of wholesaler and manufacturing units have already been sealed. The rest will be sealed in due course.
18. Director, IT informed that the data from the border check post is being monitored to ensure the smooth functioning of the software. The staff posted at one border checkpost had connectivity issues, which is being resolved by taking overhead connection.
19. Director, Panchayat and DMA informed that pre-monsoon and disinfection work is going on in all Panchayats/municipal areas.
20. The Nodal Officer for Quarantine facilities informed that 14 individuals were in the quarantine facility at Mayem Residency, eight at Old Goa Residency, 14 at Margao Residency and five at Acron Homes at Candolim. He is visiting these facilities regularly.
21. The issue of opening of shops pertaining to sale of cashew was deliberated by the SEC. It was observed that S.No 6(C)(ii) of the MHA guidelines allows for marketing and sale of cashews and therefore the opening of shops selling cashews can be allowed.

22. Director Panchayat informed that Watson Industries requested to grant permission for keeping their labourers in a nearby Hotel. The SEC directed that the permitted Industries are allowed to make arrangements for stay of workers' within their premises as far as possible and/or adjacent buildings while ensuring that the conditions laid down in the revised guidelines of the MHA dated 15/04/2020 be adhered to.
23. An issue was raised regarding permitting the functioning of Crushers. Railways have raised this issue in view of their requirement for ballast for the railways tracks. As per the MHA guidelines, mines and mineral production, their transportation, and activities incidental to the mining operations is permitted as per the Clause 15(vii) of the guidelines. Crushers falls within the category of incidental activity for mining, and is a permitted activity.

Committee also conveyed to all concerned that as per MHA orders, any person violating these containment measures or not complying with the above directions will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action u/s 188 of the IPC.
