

Minutes of Meeting of the State Executive Committee held at the Forest Bhavan, on 27th April, 2020

On 27/04/2020, a meeting of State Executive Committee (SEC) was held under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary (also Principal Secretary, PWD), Goa and the following other members of the SEC also attended:

1. Shri Puneet Goel, Principal Secretary, Science and Technology
2. Shri S.K. Bhandari, Secretary, Transport
3. Shri Sanjay Kumar, Secretary Revenue, Member Secretary, SEC & SDMA

The SEC was briefed about the reports on Law & Order, Trucks Movement, Relief & Shelters, and Covid Status Report (copy attached).

The other officers (as per the list Annexed), also attended the meeting as special invitees.

After deliberation on the current situation, the SEC noted and decided the following:


1. **Status of COVID19:** Secretary Health informed that no new Covid-19 case has been detected after 3rd April 2020. As on date, Goa has had seven positive cases of Covid-19, and all seven patients have recovered. After recovery, these patients were shifted to a Quarantine facility outside the Covid Hospital, as per norms for further quarantine. 113 tests for Covid (this includes tests done on the samples collected so far of those who were surveyed during the House-to-House survey), were done during the last 24 hours, on SARI/ILI patients, all of which were negative. The SEC noted with caution that Goa had not yet faced any community transmission.
2. The SEC briefed the attendees about the Video Conference that Hon'ble PM held with the Chief Ministers, and advised the following
 - a. Should continue to be conservative for grant of any relaxation beyond that permitted by MHA. States could make it more stringent depending on local conditions
 - b. The initiatives and action plan taken by States and UTs should be properly documented, for the future administration.
 - c. Study the current legal framework with respect to the implementation strategies, and suggest legal changes in Epidemic Act, and Disaster Management Act, 2005, based on the field experience.
3. Secretary, Ports informed that the 57 out of 60 crew of Marella Discovery have received e-Pass from DG Shipping office, and others are expected to receive it soon. Thereafter, the crew would move by road. The SEC was informed that the police will escort them to the designated paid quarantine facility on arrival at the State border.

4. Secretary, WCD informed that SHGs have produced 19,600 masks. Collector, North-Goa has been given a stock for further use.
5. PCE(PWD) informed that the pump at Padocem would be repaired today, and the new pump would be installed by this weekend. The water supply to other areas is normal. The department has restarted 107 ongoing works and 4468 workers have been engaged on these sites.
6. Director, IT informed that information on goods vehicles is now also being entered as per police requirements. Police specific changes have been incorporated and have been launched. However, the incorporation of the changes, as required by the Health department, is going on.
7. Shri Kunal, District Observer informed that about 40% of the permitted shops are open in Panjim area. DMA also added that about 35 and 40 percent of permitted shops are open in various urban areas. Similarly, the Director, Panchayat informed that 55 to 60 percent of permitted shops are open in the rural areas. Shri Keshav Kumar, District Observer also shared similar information that in general 30-40% of the permitted shops are now open.
8. The Nodal Officer (Foreigners) informed that till date 6467 foreigners have left Goa in 33 special ferry flights from the Goa Airport.
9. Secretary, Civil Supply informed that government staff has been deployed at FPS shops for monitoring the ration distribution purpose as per requirements of Govt of India. Normal distribution has started in the North. In the South, there were problems at a few shops which were being sorted out. She also informed that the department is sending Groceries-on-Wheels to selected areas in view of the Ramzan related festivities.
10. Secretary, Law informed that the department has started the registration process from today. In addition to marriage registrations 10 documents have been registered today.
11. Shri CR Garg, District Observer informed that the prices of essential items have stabilized and vegetable prices have come down with the arrival of sufficient supply from neighbouring States.
12. Secretary, Panchayats informed that Panchayat Secretaries are issuing permissions for the permitted works, and activities are now picking up. About 4939 labourers have been engaged in various works.
13. The Nodal Officer for Quarantine facilities informed that a total of 49 persons are sheltered in six quarantine facilities. He is visiting these facilities regularly.



14. CE, WRD informed that the pre-monsoon works are going on smoothly. He would be able to finish most of the essential work before the monsoon.
15. Director, Transport informed that 64 buses have been used for the relief works and 146 buses were operational today for ferrying the government staff and healthcare workers. For running buses for the relief works, the SEC advised the Director, Transport, Secretary, Health, and the Collectors to rationalise the number of buses required.
16. Secretary, Agriculture informed that the agricultural activities are normal. With 12 Harvesters working in the fields, 73% harvesting is complete.

Committee also conveyed to all concerned that as per MHA orders, any person violating these containment measures or not complying with the above directions will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action u/s 188 of the IPC.
