

## LIST OF SCHEMES IMPLEMENTED UNDER THIS COLLECTORATE NORTH

**1. MPLADS:-** The Members of Parliament Local Area Development Division is entrusted with the responsibility of implementation of Members of Parliament Local Area Development Scheme (MPLADS). Under the scheme, each MP has the choice to suggest to the District Collector for work to the tune of Rs. 5 Crores per annum to be taken up in his/her constituency.

The Rajya Sabha Members of Parliament can recommend works in one or more district in the State from where he/she has been elected.

The Nominated Members of the Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha may select any one or more Districts from any one State in the Country for implementation of their choice of work under the scheme. The Ministry has issued the guidelines on MPLADS Scheme including implementation and monitoring of the scheme. The Department has initiated all necessary steps to ensure that the scheme is successfully implemented in the field.

**2. SAGY:** - Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi launched the Saansad Adarsh Gram Yojana (SAGY) on 11<sup>th</sup> October, 2014 on the birth anniversary of Lok Nayak Jai Prakash Narayan at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi.

The goal was to develop three Adarsh Grams by March 2019, of which one was to be achieved by 2016. Thereafter, five such Adarsh Grams (one per year) will be selected and developed by 2024.

Since, the SAGY has activities cutting across different spheres; in order to implement the Scheme successfully close coordination and convergence will be required across different Ministries, departments, Schemes of the Government of India, MPLADS, State Government and the private sector. Tied and untied funds for e.g. untied resources of the Gram Panchayats like own revenue, Central and State Finance Commission grants etc must be used to optimize implementation. Ministry of Rural Development will be nodal Ministry coordinating and monitoring the Scheme closely to ensure its efficient implementation. In order to operationalize the strategies the central sector and centrally sponsored schemes along with the state schemes will have to be implemented in a convergent and integrated manner to generate maximum synergy. The Ministries/Departments concerned will take appropriate action to make suitable changes in the Guidelines to enable priority to be given to the Adarsh Gram.

**3. Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Scheme:** - Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Scheme launched by the Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, on 22<sup>nd</sup> January, 2015 at Panipat in Haryana. The Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Scheme was launched and implemented by Government of Goa on 06<sup>th</sup> May, 2015 in North Goa District of the State of Goa, since North Goa District was initially selected among the 100 District for implementation of the Scheme by the Government of India.

Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Scheme is Central Sector Scheme (CSS), implemented through State Government through District Collectors/District Magistrates in convergence with Departments Like Directorate of Panchayat, Labour Commission, Directorate of Education, Directorate of Health, Police Department, Directorate of Social Welfare, Directorate of District Rural Development Agency and NGOs liked Childline and Children Rights in Goa.

The overall goal of the Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Scheme is to celebrate the girl child and enable her education. The objectives of the scheme are as under:-

1. To prevent gender biased sex selective elimination.
2. To ensure survival and protection of the girl child.
3. To ensure education and participation of girl child.

Timely meetings and various activities to create awareness and sensitization of the scheme such as street plays, rallies, short films, felicitation of girl achievers and celebration of National Girl Child Day in various Talukas of the North Goa District under the Chairpersonship of the Collector/District Magistrate North have been undertaken annually in collaboration with various Department.

**4. M/s Universal Women Helpline:** -The Women Helpline will provide 24 hrs. Emergency response to all women affected by violence both in public and private sphere. All the existing emergency services such as Police (100), Fire (101), Women Helpline (1091), Hospital/Ambulance (102), Emergency Response Services (108), NALSA Helpline for free legal Services (15100) and Child Helpline (1098) would be integrated with this Women Helpline. The objectives of the Scheme are:

1. Provide toll-free 24 hours telecom service to women affected by violence seeking support and information,
2. Facilitate crisis intervention through referral to police/hospital/ambulance services

3. Provide information about the appropriate support services available to the women affected by violence in her particular situation within the local area in which she resides or is employed and
4. Creation and maintenance of a comprehensive referral database by the Helpline within its local area. Anyone can call on 181 helpline number for assistance.

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**5. M/s SAKHI One Stop Centre:** -One Stop Centres (OSCs) are intended to support women affected by violence, in private and public spaces, within the family, community and at the workplace. Women facing physical, sexual, emotional, psychological and economic abuse irrespective of age, class, caste, education status, marital status, race and culture will be facilitated with support and redressal. The objectives of the scheme are:

1. To provide integrated support and assistance to women affected by violence, both in private and public spaces under one roof and
2. To facilitate immediate emergency and non-emergency access to a range of service including medical, legal, psychological and counseling support under one roof to fight against any forms of violence against women.

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**6. Goa Victim Compensation Scheme, 2012:-** The Goa Victim Compensation Scheme, 2012 has been notified by the Government vide Notification No 2/91/2010-HD(G) dated 17/12/2012 in the Official Gazette dated 20/12/2012 for providing funds for the purpose of compensation to the victim or his dependents who have suffered loss or injury as a result of the crime and who require rehabilitation.

The applicant/victim is required to fill the Form "I" prescribed by the Government under the Scheme and same shall be submitted to the Collector of concerned district along with the mandatory documents.

The office of Collector shall thereafter examine the application & documents as per the requirement of scheme and if found to be in order, then the same is recommended for compensation to the Government as per the schedule notified by the Government in the scheme.

The Government take a final decision on the grant of compensation to the applicant/victim as per the eligibility criteria.

Once the compensation is sanctioned, the same is released directly in the bank account of the victim
