Breeding Policy for Cattle and Buffaloes
for the State of Goa

Government Notification 15-34-AH/2010-
-2011/1284 dated 26-11-2010 in regards to the

Breeding Policy for Cattle and Buffaloes for the State of Goa published in Official Gazette, Sr. I No. 13 dated 02-12-2010 is hereby revised by the Government and republished for kind information of the public.

(I) (a) *Breeding of Nondescript cattle.*— The Nondescript cattle would be artificially bred with 100% Jersey Germ-plasm of high pedigree bulls. Jersey breed is small in size as compared to Holstein Fresian and high yielding breeds, so as to upgrade the non descript cattle. The present cattle population stands at-40,076.

The F1 generation would be bred with 100% Jersey Germ-plasm of high pedigree bulls. It is expected that F1 and F2 generations would

perform well under the hot and humid climatic conditions.

(b) *Cross-bred cattle*.— The Committee observed that the present cross-bred population is 17,536 which is substantial. The blood level of Exotic Germ-plasm is 50-75%. It is proposed that the HF X cattle be bred with 50% HFX 50% Sahiwal Germ-plasm, while Jy X Cattle be bred with 50% Jy X 50% Sahiwal Germ-plasm of high pedigree. This would introduce good genetic traits (Black hoof, disease resistance, regular breeders, increased milk yield with higher fat %).

(c) *Nondescript Buffaloes*.— Goa State doesn't have its own recognized breed of buffaloes. The indigenous/nondescript buffaloes population stands at 31,913.

Murrah breed of buffaloes requires high maintenance cost, late maturity, occurrence of prolapse and repeat breeders. However in Pandharpuri breed maintenance cost is lower, problems like agalactia after calf mortality are seldom, less prolapse cases and the breed is comparatively smaller and compact.

The non descript buffaloes be bred with 100% Pandharpuri Germ-plasm of high pedigree while the existing Murrah Buffaloes with only Murrah Germ-plasm.

(II) Farms

The Directorate of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services has 2 (two) Farms, namely:—

(1) Cattle Breeding Farm, Copardem-Satari.

(2) Government Livestock Farm, Dhat-Mollem.

(1) *Government Livestock Farm, Dhat-Mollem*.— (a) *Murrah Breed*—

The Farm maintains pure-bred Murrah Stock procured under National Project for Cattle and Buffaloes Breeding Programme. Presently, the

breed is bred with 100% Murrah Germ-plasm of high pedigree from recognized Semen Banks.

It is proposed that the Breeding Policy of breeding Murrah Buffaloes to purity with pure Murrah Germ-plasm from high pedigree buffaloes bulls be continued.

Since Pandharpuri breed of buffaloes due to their good traits, well suited under the hot-agro climatic condition is recommended for introduction in the form of a small herd of 50 Pure Pandharpuri Heifers from the Pandharpuri breeding tract in Maharashtra. This would serve also as a demonstration unit.

(b) *Red Sindhi Cattle*—

This pure breed of Red Sindhi is inherited from the erstwhile Portuguese regime. At present, the breed is bred with 100% Red Sindhi Germ-plasm of high pedigree.

This breed is to be maintained by breeding them with 100% Red Sindhi Germ-plasm.

(2) *Cattle Breeding Farm, Copardem, Satari*.— The farm maintains Pure Sahiwal, Gir breeds and their cross-breeds.

(a) *Gir Breed*—

Presently the pure Gir breed which is high yielding is bred with Pure Gir Germ-plasm of high pedigree to purity so as to maintain the indigenous breed. It is proposed to continue to breed Gir to purity.

(b) *Sahiwal Breed*—

The pure Sahiwal breed was brought from Punjab under National Project for Cattle and Buffalo Breeding Programme. Presently the breed is bred with 100% Sahiwal Germ-plasm of high pedigree. It is proposed to breed the Sahiwal breed with 100% Sahiwal Germ-plasm to purity to preserve the pure breed from extinction as it is one of the threatened breed.

(c) Sahiwal and Gir (Low yielding)—

The low yielding Gir and Sahiwal breeds are proposed to be bred with 100% Holstein Fresien Germ-plasm of high pedigree so as to upgrade the progeny and augment milk production.

(d) Cross-bred Cattle—

The cross-bred cattle Gir and Sahiwal crosses are bred with Sahiwal Germ-plasm. It is proposed to continue the present breeding policy of breeding the cross-bred cattle with 100% Sahiwal Germ-plasm of high pedigree.

(III) Training of Veterinarians, Paravets and Farmers.— The farmers and paravets were trained earlier to refresh their knowledge as regards the breeding activities.

It is proposed to train the farmers for 1 (one) day at Stockmen Training Centre, Curti Ponda, ICAR, Old Goa, Goa Milk Union Producer Union, Curti Ponda on breeding activities and benefits which would be accrued.

A refresher training to Paravets (Veterinary Assistants/Extension Officers) is proposed to be continued for 2 days at Stockmen Training Centre, Curti Ponda with emphasis on practical training at the Government Farms (Cattle Breeding Farm, Copardem and Government Livestock Farm, Dhat-Mollem).

A Seminar on breeding activities and Dairy Management is proposed to be arranged wherein luminaries/Scientists would throw light on the subjects.

(IV) Record keeping.— Breeding Card:

The Breeding Cards were introduced at the field level when the Breeding Policy was operational. However, it is observed that the farmers did not give the desired co-operation to the field staff and the same could not be continued.

Now, it is proposed to introduce the Breeding Cards and charge the farmers a nominal fee of Rs. 1/- per card (Pink colored for Cattle and Blue colored for Buffaloes). A specimen of Breeding Card is appended.

(v) Cattle Breeders Associations.— It was decided to form “Cattle Breeders Association” which may help in implementation of “State Cattle Breeding Policy”.

(vi) Goa does not have its recognized breed. No work has been done in this direction. Therefore, it is proposed to form a core Committee so as to ascertain the cattle having common phenotypic characters amongst the nondescript cattle population which can be recognized as a breed.

The Committee shall be as follows:

The Breeding Policy would be for a period of 3 (three) years.
