Horticulture is the major activity in the State as it occupies more than 60% of the total cropped area. The small and fragmented holdings coupled with high cost of labour have increased the cost of cultivation with corresponding reduction in income in recent years. It is, therefore proposed to support this sector with various incentives and assistance so as to encourage youth to take up production of various horticulture crops.

Short title and commencement.— (i) The scheme shall be called “Development of Horticulture 2018”.

(ii) The scheme shall come into force with retrospective effect from 1-4-2018 and shall remain in force till it is withdrawn. The beneficiaries who have applied after 1-4-2018 shall be considered to avail benefits as per the new pattern of assistance under this scheme.

(iii) The scheme shall cover all Talukas of the State of Goa.

1. *Objectives.*— (i) To increase the area and productivity of horticultural crops.

(ii) To boost floriculture activity.

(iii) To increase production of quality vegetables.

(iv) To promote cultivation of fruits, flowers and spices on a large scale to meet the growing demand in the State.

(v) To promote agriculture among students.

(vi) To promote greening of Goa in an economically viable and sustainable manner.

2. *Components.*— (i) Assistance for Coconut Area Expansion.

(ii) Assistance for Cultivation for Banana/Pineapple/Papaya.

(iii) Assistance for Cultivation of Flowers.

(iv) Assistance for Cultivation of Fruits/Spices.

(v) Assistance for purchase of Vegetable Seeds.

(vi) Assistance for Distribution of Fruit Plants for Homestead Garden.

4. *Eligibility.*— (i) All owners of land willing to cultivate agricultural/horticultural crops are eligible to avail the benefits of this scheme provided applicant's name should reflect in Krishi Card abstract as owner or having right for cultivation.

(ii) The land shall be in his/her own name or inherited or taken on lease for a period of not less than ten years. Those holding land on lease should have a valid period of at least 8 years on the date of application.

However, in case of annual flowers and vegetable, lease period will be minimum two years.

(iii) Minimum area for assistance for cultivation of Coconut, Mango, Pineapple, Papaya, Cashew, Chickoo, Kokum, Guava, Breadfruit, Jackfruit, Banana and Spice crops will be 0.1 ha. and for other crops i.e. flowers and vegetables will be 0.05 ha.

(iv) The criteria of minimum land requirement is to be dispensed for the component “Distribution of Fruit Plants to Households”, “Development of Kitchen Gardens” and 50% Assistance for Vegetable Seeds” as they are often planted as backyard plants.

5. *Pattern of Assistance.*— 5.1 Assistance for Coconut Area Expansion:

(i) The average cost of cultivation in the State of Goa of Coconut is about Rs. 67,000/- with 160 palms per ha. An assistance of 75% on the

cost of cultivation limited to Rs. 50,000/- per ha. and in proportion of area covered at recommended spacing shall be provided to farmers. The assistance shall be extended for taking up of coconut plantation with minimum area of 0.1 ha. Maximum subsidy for one beneficiary shall be restricted to 5.0 hectares.

(ii) The subsidy provided under Coconut Development Board scheme by GOI would be adjusted within the above assistance and only balance assistance would be provided under this State Sector Scheme.

In case, no assistance is provided under GOI for this component the entire assistance shall be paid under State Sector.

(iii) The assistance will be provided under State Sector in two instalments on 60:40 basis over a period of two years based on survival percentage of plants.

However, assistance under GOI shall be released as per the pattern of assistance of GOI schemes.

5.2 Assistance for Cultivation for Banana/Pineapple/Papaya.—

(i) The cost of cultivation of Banana, Pineapple & Papaya is estimated Rs. 1,60,000/- per ha. An assistance of 75% of the cost upto a maximum of Rs. 1,20,000/- per ha. will be provided in proportion to area cultivated.

(ii) The assistance will be provided under State Sector in two instalments on 75:25 basis over a period of two years based on survival percentage of plants.

However, assistance under GOI shall be released as per the pattern of assistance of GOI schemes.

(iii) Minimum plantation at a time of at least 320 suckers of tissue culture or 250 suckers/seedlings of other varieties of Banana/Papaya or 4500 suckers of Pineapple in one block at recommended spacing shall be considered for assistance with maximum restricted to 4.0 ha.

5.3 Assistance for Cultivation of Flowers.—
(i) The cost of cultivation of bulbous/perennial flower crops is estimated to be Rs. 1,60,000/- per ha. and the cost of cultivation of loose flowers is estimated to be Rs. 1,00,000/- per ha.

Flower crops such as Rose, Jasmine spp., Crossandra, Chrysanthemum, shall be considered under perennial crops.

Flower crops such as Tuberose, Gladiolus etc., shall be considered under annual bulbous crops.

Flower crops such as Marigold etc., shall be considered under seasonal loose flower crop.

An assistance of 75% of the cost of cultivation limited to Rs. 1,20,000/- per ha. for bulbous/perennial flower crops and an assistance of Rs. 75,000/- per ha. for loose flowers crops shall be provided for new area expansion.

The assistance will be provided under State Sector in case of biennial/perennial crops in two instalments on 75:25 basis over a period of two years based on survival percentage of plants. In case of seasonal flower crop assistance shall be provided as one time assistance upon establishment of the crop. However, assistance under GOI shall be released as per the pattern of assistance of GOI schemes.

(ii) The subsidy provided by GOI would be adjusted within the above assistance and only balance assistance would be provided under this State Sector Scheme. In case no assistance is provided under GOI for this component, the entire assistance shall be paid under State Sector.

(iii) The assistance would be provided upon actual planting and verification of its complete maintenance by farmers. The assistance would be provided to minimum area of 0.05 ha. cultivated either individually or by group of Farmers, Women, Self Help Groups (SHG) etc., and for maximum of 4 ha. of area.

5.4 *Assistance for Cultivation of Fruits/Spices.*— (i) The average cost of cultivation of fruits and spices in the State of Goa is about Rs. 80,000/- per ha. An assistance of 75% of the cost of cultivation limited to Rs. 60,000/- per ha. and in proportion of area covered at recommended spacing shall be provided to farmers.

The assistance shall be extended for all types of fruits and spices cultivated with minimum area of 0.1 ha. All major and minor fruit/spice crops which could be cultivated commercially in Goa would be assisted under this component.

(ii) The subsidy provided by GOI would be adjusted within the above assistance and only balance assistance would be provided under this State Sector Scheme.

In case, no assistance is provided under GOI for this component the entire assistance shall be paid under State Sector.

(iii) The assistance will be provided under State Sector in two instalments on 60:40 basis over a period of two years based on survival percentage of plants. However, assistance under GOI shall be released as per the pattern of assistance of GOI schemes.

5.5 *Assistance for purchase of vegetable seeds.*— Vegetable seeds are required to be replaced for better productivity and pest and disease resistance at least once in two to three years in case of open pollinated varieties and every season in case of F-1 hybrids.

(i) An assistance to the extent of 50% of cost shall be provided as subsidy at source for purchase of vegetable seed of open pollinated and F-1 hybrid varieties through the Departmental sale points or through the Zonal Agriculture Offices (ZAO).

(ii) An assistance to the extent of 75% of standard cost shall be provided as subsidy at source for purchase of vegetable seedlings of open pollinated and F-1 hybrid varieties through the Departmental sale points or through the Zonal Agriculture Offices (ZAO)

or through nurseries or Farmers Groups promoted by Zonal Agriculture Offices/ATMA's etc.

5.6 *Assistance for Distribution of Fruit Plants for Homestead Garden.*— (i) Each household shall be provided with one or two fruit bearing plants free of cost for planting in their back yard.

(ii) The cost of seedlings/grafts supplied to each family shall not exceed Rs. 150.

(iii) Each Constituency shall be supplied minimum 1000 fruit bearing plants as per the need or as many number of fruit bearing plants within the overall cost ceiling of Rs. 1.50 lakhs per constituency.

(iv) Schools, Colleges, NGO's, Farmers Clubs, Cultural Clubs taking up tree planting in their land or plantation drive shall also be provided with maximum of 200 plants apart from the plants provided for households upon recommendation of Hon'ble Minister of Agriculture/MLA of respective constituency with approval of the Director of Agriculture and subject to the availability of funds.

However, except for schools and colleges the expenditure for the same shall be within the overall financial allocation of Rs. 1.50 lakhs per constituency.

6. *Guidelines & Procedure.*— (i) The interested cultivators shall submit their application in the prescribed format along with Krishi Card abstract copy.

(ii) Farmers shall take up the work/plantation as per the guidelines of the scheme with proper recommended spacing. They shall ensure to use quality planting material from the registered Government or private nurseries. In case planting material such as banana, pineapple, flower crops etc. is purchased from local farmer the same shall be approved/certified for its quality and genuineness by the respective Zonal Agricultural Officer.

Upon completion the farmer shall submit bills and receipts along with necessary annexure as per the scheme.

(iii) The project/site will be inspected by Zonal Agricultural Officer or his representative and recommend for release of subsidy as per the pattern of assistance/guidelines and forward to the concerned District Agricultural Officer (DAO) for sanction.

(iv) The District Agricultural Officer shall examine the claim and accord expenditure sanction for subsidy within his powers.

(v) The District Agricultural Officer shall draw and disburse the subsidy.

7. *Procedure for procurement of inputs.*— (1) The inputs such as planting material, seed which are required by the Department but not available in the State shall be procured from the Government/Semi Government Agencies/ Government Undertakings/Agricultural Research Institutions/Private Agencies/Farms outside State in case such varieties/ formulations are not available with Government/Private Agencies/Farmers in the State of Goa so as to give material/inputs to farming community that have good market demand, varietal characters and qualities. The procurement/purchase shall be done by following normal codal formalities/procedure in case the purchase is not to be done from Government/Semi Government Agencies/Government Undertakings outside State.

2. The codal formalities/procedures need not be followed for procurement of planting material/seed from local farmers and Government owned organizations like Seed Corporations, Regional Research Centres and Agricultural Universities from within and outside the State as per Government approval conveyed by Order No. 3/5/Ext/Farm/49/2013-14/D.Agri/656 dated 04-02-2014.

8. *Checks to be adopted and monitoring.*— 10% of cases will be randomly inspected by District Agriculture Officer/Horticulture section.

9. *Interpretation.*— If any question arises regarding interpretation of any clause, word, expression of the scheme, the decision shall

lie with the Government, which shall be final and binding on all concerned.

10. *Redressal of grievances and disputes.*— Grievances if any, arising out of the implementation of this scheme, shall be heard and decided by the Minister for Agriculture and the decision of the Minister for Agriculture in this regard shall be final and binding on all concerned.

The Minister of Agriculture shall have the powers to grant any relaxation in general or on case to case basis regarding procedure and guidelines of the Scheme in the interest of promoting production of fruit, flower and vegetable crops in the State of Goa.

Power to grant relaxation as regards to administrative procedures in general or on case to case basis shall lie with Director of Agriculture and his decision in this regard shall be final and binding on all concerned.

Whereas, the draft rules, namely, the Goa Motor Vehicles (Amendment) Rules, 2018, which the Government of Goa proposed to make in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 26, 28, 38, 65, 95, 96, 107, 111, 138, 159, 176 and 213 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 (Central Act 59 of 1988), so as to further amend the Goa Motor Vehicles Rules, 1991, were pre-published as required by sub-section (1) of section 212 of the said Act, vide Notification No. D.Tpt/Est/2731/2018/5279 dated 15-10-2018 in the Official Gazette, Series I No. 29 dated 19-10-2018, inviting objections and suggestions from all the persons likely to be affected thereby within a period of fifteen days from the date of publication of the said Notification in the Official Gazette;

And whereas, the said Official Gazette was made available to the public on 19-10-2018.

And whereas, no objections and suggestions have been received from the public on the said draft rules by the Government within the stipulated period.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 26, 28, 38, 65, 95, 96, 107, 111, 138, 159, 176 and 213 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 (Central Act 59 of 1988) and all other powers enabling it in this behalf, the Government of Goa hereby makes the following rules so as to further amend the Goa Motor Vehicles Rules, 1991, namely:—

1. *Short title and commencement.*— (1) These rules may be called the Goa Motor Vehicles (Amendment) Rules, 2018.

(2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. *Insertion of new rule 299A.*— After rule 299 of the Goa Motor Vehicles Rules, 1991, the following rule shall be inserted, namely:—

“299A. *Prohibition against release of motor vehicle involved in accident.*— (1) No Court shall release a motor vehicle involved in an accident resulting in death or bodily injury or damage to property, when such vehicle is not covered by the policy of insurance against third party risks taken in the name of registered owner or when the registered owner fails to furnish copy of such insurance policy despite demand by investigating police officer, unless, and until the registered owner furnishes sufficient security to the satisfaction of the Court to pay compensation that may be awarded in a claim case arising out of such accident.

(2) Where the motor vehicle is not covered by a policy of insurance against third party risks, or when registered owner

of the vehicle fails to furnish copy of such policy in circumstances mentioned in sub-rule (1), the motor vehicle shall be sold off in public auction by the Magistrate having jurisdiction over the area where the accident had occurred, on expiry of three months of the vehicle being taken in possession by the investigating police officer, and proceeds thereof shall be deposited with the Claims Tribunal having jurisdiction over the area in question, within

fifteen days for purpose of satisfying the compensation that may have been awarded, or may be awarded in a claim case arising out of such accident.”.
