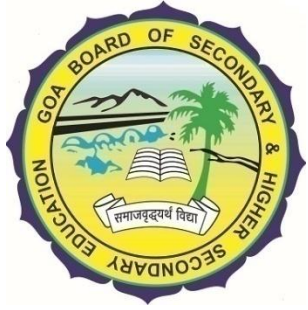

- The special assessment scheme included two Board Examinations, 1st Term Exam Dec-Jan 2021-22 and 2nd term April 2022.
- The Final result is prepared which includes performance of First Term exam (50% portion), Second Term exam (50% portion) and performance of internal assessment (20%).

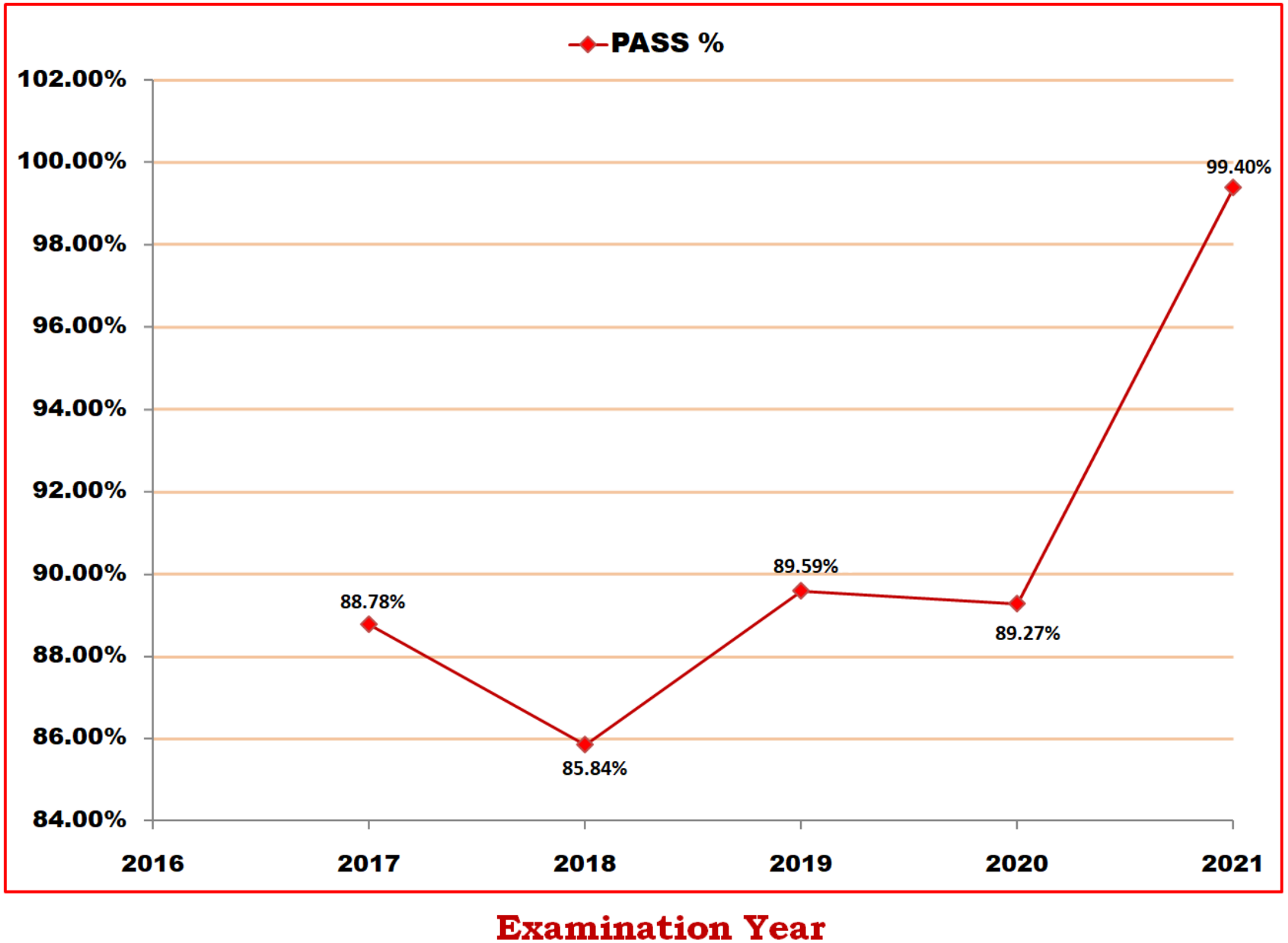


- There is no separate marksheet for Term 1 & Term 2 exam.
