It also highlights advancements in forensic infrastructure, modern policing systems and digital integration, while offering insights into career opportunities in policing and forensic science.

Addressing the gathering, Chief Minister Dr. Pramod Sawant said, "Under the leadership of Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Hon'ble Home Minister Amit Shah, India has transitioned from colonial-era laws to a modern, citizen-centric justice system."
